("Canadian Energy Services" or the "Partnership") announced today that it will pay a cash distribution of \$0.0792 per Class A Common limited partnership unit ("Class A Unit") on May 15, 2006 in respect of operations for the period from April 1, 2006 to April 30, 2006, to Unitholders of record on April 30, 2006.

Based on a Class A Unit closing price on April 19, 2006 of \$10.00 and annualized distribution payments of \$0.9504 per unit, the Partnership's current annual cash-on-cash yield amounts to 9.5 percent.

Canadian Energy Services designs and implements drilling fluid systems for the oil and gas industry, in particular relating to drilling medium to deep vertical and directional wells and horizontal wells in western Canada.
